Organizers: The Academy of Model Aeronautics, in association with the International Radio

Control Helicopter Association.

Site Location: The World Championships will be held in Muncie, Indiana USA. This 1000 acre

model flying site is the home and headquarters of the Academy of Model Aeronautics. Four 700' long runways are available. Three runways feature a paved surface the fourth is a grass surface. The World Championships will be conducted on the paved surfaces. The entire 10-meter x 10-meter box, and the start box will be carpet covered. Ample room exists on this site for multiple flight lines, as well as practice areas. Off site practice sites will be made available. Also featured on the site is the National Model Aviation Museum. This soon to be expanded facility is a repository of aermodeling's firsts and finest. Tours of the facilities and the AMA Headquarters operation will be available during the

World Championships.

License: Each competitor must possess a valid 2001 Sporting License.

Language: English

Radio Frequency Information:

Only transmitters on frequencies legal in the United States may be operated in the United States. These are specific channels in the 72 MHz band only. These modules & receivers are currently available from the major radio manufacturers in the US. If you are unable to obtain proper frequency modules and receivers from suppliers in your country, Futaba USA and JR (Horizon Hobbies) will loan receivers and modules to World Championships competitors. All borrowed equipment will have to be returned at the conclusion of the competition. Further details, and equipment loan forms will be available in Bulletin 2.
